



Sue Cortese Fabric Dyeing Workshop

In this class we will go through several exercises to create your own colorful cloth. You will learn several different techniques for using the MX Fiber Reactive dyes with low water immersion. We will talk about the color wheel so that you have a basic understanding of combining colors before mixing them in the exercises. I am happy to help mix a color, however, the specific shade to match your project might not be possible because of the colors used in class. The three exercises include making a light to dark gradation of a single color, making a color to color gradation to find the colors that lie between, and experimenting with pre-soda-soaked fabric. The participant can choose to make a single color ombre, a rainbow piece or all-over multi-colored piece. Two kit options are available; you must choose one.

Save your spot now. The class will be held in the **Beechwood Lodge** on **Friday, April 19, 2019** from 9:00 AM to noon. Lodge will be open at 8:30 AM for set up.

The cost of the class is \$35.00 for members and \$45.00 for non- members. Kits are \$25 (or \$10 if you supply PFD fabric.). Your payment in full insures your place in the class until the limit of 20 has been reached. Non-guild members will be admitted after April 01, 2019.

BASIC FABRIC DYEING SUPPLY LIST

Kit available for \$25 which includes fabric, dyes, auxiliary chemicals, bottles, and gloves.

Or \$10 without fabric.

Students will need to bring:

- 3 yards of PFD 100% cotton fabric (if NOT purchasing full kit)
- 5 plastic/disposable cups 10oz or larger
- a gallon of water- the container cannot be re-use for drinking water, an old milk jug works well.
- Gallon zip-type bags- you will need a minimum of 12 bags. The ones with fold out bottom are great.
- 2 containers or buckets in which to carry bags filled with dye and fabric. (Personally, I use a container that is about 9" X 13" X 9" and has a lid. The lid makes transporting them much easier.)
- An apron or wear "painting" clothes
- A rag or two, and if you have one, an old tablecloth or drop cloth.
