## Participant Supply List:

- Drawing materials: pencils, tracing paper – Golden Threads will work
- Compass or other circle templates
- Sewing machine (with at least a few of decorative stitches)
- Open-toed embroidery foot – optional, but very useful (#20 Bernina)
- Sewing basics:
- Stick glue: archival, washable UHU is fine
- Masking tape, craft knife with #11 blade (optional – bring if you have one and share with others)
- Fusible interfacing: 3 yds ( Shir Tailor by Pellon is best)
- Wonder Under or some kind of fusible web
- Rotary cutter, mat and ruler
- Fabrics: Solids and batiks in contrasting colors (fat quarters are fine)  
Dots in many colors (Sassaman/FreeSpirit dotted fabric shown)
- Threads: Basic and fancy
- Digital camera, optional, but very useful
